I am a clinical social worker (MSW) with a specialization in trauma and mental health; crisis management; family dynamics and parental mentorship; and Psycho-Educational Empowerments for children and adolescence.

I am passionate about helping individuals and communities find empowerment through healing. My work in Chance 4 All allowed me to employ my professional expertise into meaningful work. Specifically, working with girls who, due to the dynamics of gender, are more vulnerable in the face of inequalities and under-privileged communities.

As a social worker in Israel (2006 - 2014) I worked in the following trajectories: Management and Implementation of intervention programs for families, management of trauma and mental health emergency centres, social policy designs, community welfare programs, among many other projects and roles. Since in Zambia (2014-2021), I volunteered in the American International School of Lusaka (AISL) in the following ways. I founded and led parental support groups; co-designed and delivered stress management programs for IB students (grades 11 and 12); co-led Social Awareness program for high school students. Additionally, I volunteered in the Parent-Teacher-Association; the AISL Triathlon committee; and the Torpedoes swimming club Executive committee. Most importantly, in 2018, I joined Chance 4 All as a board advisor and mentor.

At Chance4All I designed and implemented an Educational Empowerment and Mentoring Program for girls. This program provided young girls from under-privileged communities with a safe space to feel empowered, seen, and heard, while providing them with the tools and skills to succeed in their adult lives as independent women.
